PAEDIATRIC AND ADULT FIRST AID COURSE

There are still a few places left on an excellent first aid course delivered by Sandwell Adult and Family Learning at Thimblemill Library. The cost is only £5 for the whole course for any parents, grandparents or carers with children under 16 attending school. At the end of the course you will receive an in house certificate of achievement which is valid for 3 years, plus a first aid kit.

The course is for 7 weeks, beginning on Thursday 2 October and ending on 27 November, with no classes on 16 or 30 October. All classes are 9.30 - 11.30 a.m. To enrol please come to the library on Thursday 2 October at **9.00 a.m.** Bringing with you 2 pieces of ID e.g. passport, driving licence, utility bill, bank statement, plus your £5 fee. MONTHLY REFLECTION - OCTOBER MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The Feast of Our Lady or the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th.

The Rosary is a prayer in which tells the story of Jesus, in four parts. We mediate on the virtues of the Life, Death, Passion and Glory of Jesus Christ and his Blessed Mother, the Virgin Mary. It owes its origin to St Dominic.

When we pray the Rosary, we say certain prayers, like the Our Father and Hail Mary. But we also remember stories that are called "mysteries". Mysteries are stories about God, and so we never know enough about them. They never get old, because they keep telling us things we never knew before.

Stations of the Cross are held on the first Friday of the month at 10.30 a.m. at Church.
