


#### **Corona Virus Guidance**

We are continuing to monitor the Government advice on the ongoing Coronavirus outbreak. At school, we are following the advice given to prevent the spread of any viral infection. This includes encouraging the children to maintain good basic hygiene by washing their hands regularly and following the 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' advice when coughing and sneezing. All toilets have been restocked with liquid soap and bars of antibacterial soap and we have purchased alcohol free, hypoallergenic hand sanitiser pumps which will be installed in all classrooms by the end of the week.

The main message that we are continuing to share with the children is to keep calm and try not to worry about the virus but to maintain good standards of hygiene in school by washing hands regularly and following the advice above regarding coughs and sneezes.

#### Father Hudson's Good Shepherd Appeal

All the children in school have been given a Father Hudson's collection box to keep during the season of Lent. Children are encouraged to give something up during Lent and perhaps put the money saved into their collection box. Lucy from Father Hudson's came into school before half term and spoke to the children to ensure they know just what a difference this fantastic charity can make to so many people who are less fortunate than us.
