RESIDENTIAL VISITS

We have been informed by the Local Authority that the cost of residential visits (from December 2014) has increased to $\pounds 240$ - Edgmond Hall and $\pounds 270$ - Plas Gwynant (this includes coach costs which may slightly vary).

We will shortly be sending out letters to the current Years 5 and 4 to ascertain if you would like your child to attend these visits in September.

They are really worthwhile visits and the children benefit greatly from them.

SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2014/15

The main priority is to embed the New National Curriculum programmes of study through the school thematic curriculum. Themes for each class have been developed reflecting the school's thematic approach to learning. There are five themes planned for each year group (apart from year 6) and each theme is led by either history, geography or science. Children are encouraged to make links across the curriculum and apply the basic skills they learn in English and mathematics across all subjects where applicable. Standards across school continue to be good and children are demonstrating good levels of progress to date. Tracking learning and progress over time is an ongoing school development priority.

To further support the Catholic Life of the school we are focussing on **'The Year for Consecrated Life' and recognising all religious people called upon to follow Jesus Christ in a special way.** All classes have chosen a saint to learn about and these are as follows:


- Nursery St Jude, Patron saint of desperate cases and lost causes. Feast day 28 October
- Reception St Francis, Patron saint of animals and his feast day is 4 October
- Year 1 St Nicholas, Patron saint of sailors, merchants, archers, repentant thieves, children, pawnbrokers and students in various cities and countries around Europe. His feast day is 6 December
- Year 2 St Bernadette, Patron saint for Lourdes, France, bodily illness, shepherds and shepherdesses and poverty. Her feast day is 16 April
- Year 3 St George, Patron saint of England and all the Scouts around the world. His feast day is 23 April
- Year 4 St Maximilian Kolbe, Patron saint of drug addicts, political prisoners, families, journalist and prisoners. His feast day is 14 August
- Year 5 St Peter, Patron saint of workers including bakers, bridge builders, butchers and fishermen. His feast day is 29 June
