The children are working hard in school in both of these areas. Please can I encourage you to support your child by regularly attending Mass and help with learning traditional prayers.



A Good Deed Every Day!

The season of Lent

Lent is a time to commit to God with all our hearts and it is also a time to renew our friendship with God. We can hear and ponder God's word in the scriptures more deeply.

The parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31) offers us a rich text to read. There are two main characters - the rich man and the poor man, Lazarus. Lazarus may have been anonymous to the rich man but he was not to God. Lazarus was comforted by God. He was a precious gift, a priceless treasure to be cherished, embraced and loved. The rich man did not recognise Lazarus' virtues, he saw him only as a beggar. Remember we are all precious in God's eyes.
