Her Majesty's Inspectors visit

The following are the comments on a PSHE survey (Personal, Social and Health Education) from the recent HMI visit);

- PSHE is a great strength at St Gregory's and underpins the school's Christian ethos.
- PSHE is given high priority and as a consequence pupils' personal development is very good. Pupils are well supported by committed staff, teaching and non teaching, who work well together for the benefit of the pupils. Pupils with learning difficulties and disabilities are particularly well supported.
- Relationships between staff and pupils are very good and are characterised by respect.
- PSHE is strongly led and well managed within the school. The school's evaluation of the good quality of its PSHE provision is well founded.
- The school carefully monitors this aspect of the curriculum, as it does with other areas in the school on an ongoing basis.
- The PSHE curriculum is well planned and pupils are taught a suitable range of topics at appropriate age and stage. The 'Every Child Matters' (ECM) agenda is well established in planning. The National Healthy School strategy and other health related initiatives have been influential in the good quality of provision across the school.
- The quality of teaching and learning in PSHE is good. Pupils' attitude to learning and their behaviour are very good. Teachers use a good range of strategies, including circle time, to engage pupils in activities that develop their knowledge and skills. On occasion, questioning could be more challenging, to enable pupils to give more extended responses. Teachers are aware of the progress made by individuals.
- Pupils are developing a good understanding of factors that influence a healthy lifestyle. They readily accept the responsibilities given to them. Pupils speak highly of the care they receive in school and that they enjoy their work. They feel safe at St Gregory's.
