A REMINDER

SEPTEMBER INTAKE 2009

Reception

Children born between 01.09.05 and 31.08.06 are due to start school in September 2010. Please ensure that your child is registered, children are not automatically awarded a place if they are in Nursery or if they have an older sibling in school. The school cannot accept responsibility for the non registration of children.

Nursery

If your child was born between 01.09.05 and 31.08.06 then your child is eligible for a part time Nursery place. The closing date for registration for the Nursery is Friday 13 February 2009. Parents will be informed as to the outcome of the admissions committee decision by letter, which will be posted on Wednesday 25 March 2009.
