

A time for Reflection

2nd Sunday of Lent: Matthew 17:1-9 Jesus' friends were really amazed when they saw Jesus transformed.

3rd Sunday of Lent: John 4: 5-42 Jesus tells a woman with whom He is speaking that she should ask for Living Water.

4th Sunday of Lent: John 4: 5-42 Jesus heals a man who was born blind.

5th Sunday of Lent: John 11: 3-45 Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead.
