

Reading Curriculum

Statement of Intent

The pupils at St. Gregory's study a range of texts in each year group. We use these texts to produce various genres of writing; encouraging our pupils to become avid readers and enthusiastic authors. Our aim is to create readers who:

- have a positive attitude to reading and read a wide range of genres including fiction, non-fiction, poetry and plays.
- recommend books that they have read to their peers.
- make comparisons within and across books that they have read.
- draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives.
- prepare poems and plays to perform and learn a wide range of poetry by heart.
- participate in discussions about books they have read.
- ask questions to improve their understanding.

Reading Spines and Recommended Reading lists are also available for each Year Group which encourages the pupils to read widely across a range of genres. Pupils are given on opportunity to complete a 'Reading Quest' which enables them to write book reviews for each text that they have read. Bronze, Silver and Gold Bookmarks are given for each stage that have been completed. This is all available to view on the website.
