	Key Vocabulary	L
rainforest	A tropical woodland (with tall, densely growing trees) with a high annual rainfall.	
equator	An imaginary circle around Earth that divides Earth into 2 equal parts: the Northern and Southern Hemisphere.	
tropical climate	The climate of the tropics. A damp climate in which all 12 months have a mean temperature above 18°C.	
temperature	The degree/intensity of heat, measured by a thermometer.	
deforestation	The clearing of a wide area of trees.	
preservation	The action of protecting something e.g. preserving the trees in rainforests.	
settlements	A place where people live.	
Indigenous tribes	Groups of people that have their own cultures, languages and customs which separate them from the rest of society.	
Yanomimi tribe	The largest relatively isolated tribe in South America. They live in the rainforests and mountains of Northern Brazil and Southern Venezuela.	
vegetation	Plants found collectively in a particular area or habitat.	

Locational and place knowledge


The Amazon Rainforest is located in 9 different counties: Brazil (60% of it is here), Peru, Columbia, Ecuador, Bolivia, Venezuela, Guyana, Suriname and French Guiana.

These countries are all located in the continent South America.



Human and physical geography

The world's rainforests are full of natural physical **features**. The **4 layers of the rainforest** are:



Different groups of animals live within the different lavers because of their differing exposure to sunlight.

Because of their close proximity to the **equator**, the climate of the world's rainforests is very hot, humid and wet. A tropical rainforest experiences a significant amount of rainfall each year.

Human impact on the rainforest:

Many human activities such as logging, mining, fires, war, pollution and cattle ranching have contributed to **deforestation**. This negatively impacts the planet as the world's rainforests provide us with oxygen.
