| Key Vocabulary      |   |

| Warley<br>Woods     | A 100-acre public park in the Warley district of Smethwick, in the West Midlands.   |
| map                 | A diagram that shows the location of continents, countries, cities, roads and specific features in relation to one another. |
| key                 | Explains the symbols, numbers and colours that are used on a map.   |
| Ordnance symbols    | Pictures used on a map to represent specific types of places e.g. churches, etc.  |
| grid<br>reference   | A location on a map, which is found using vertical and horizontal numbered and lettered lines.                              |
| 8-point compass     | A tool with a magnetic pointer inside to show us where North is. The 8 points are: N, NE, E, SE, S, SW, W and NW.           |
| timeline            | A line to represent a period of time, on which important events are marked.   |
| chronological order | The arrangement of events in the order that they happened.  |
| aerial map          | A map that shows the features of a specific location from above.  |
| orienteering        | A competitive sport in which runners have to find their way across an area of land using a map and compass.                 |
| fieldwork           | Practical work carried out in the natural environment.  |

# Locational and place knowledge


Warley Woods is located in Bearwood town, which is in the region the West Midlands, in the country England.



## Geographical and fieldwork skills

Grid references identify specific locations on a map. For example, the B4182 road on the map above is located in the grid reference C2.

The **Eastings** (codes on the horizontal line) come before the Northings

#### **Human features**

Something in the human environment that has been built by humans.

### Physical features

A natural feature on the Earth's surface that has been formed by nature.

Warley Woods has a few **human features**, such as:

- Children's play area
- Golf course
- Footpaths

However, the public park is mainly filled with natural physical features, such as:

- Grass
- Soil
- Hills
