Human and physical geography

Yosemite National Park is full of many natural **physical features**, such as: waterfalls, glaciers, rivers, streams, lakes and mountains.



The landscape of Yosemite National Park is always changing due to natural factors, such as glaciers and erosion.

Water

In 1923, the City of San Francisco completed O'Shaughnessy Dam, impounding Hetch Hetchy Reservoir in Yosemite National Park. This provides water from the national park for 2 million people in San Francisco. The location of the dam within the national park caused controversy as it disrupted the beauty of the national park's physical features. San Francisco and California have changed dramatically, so the dam is now no longer needed for water supply.

Yosemite National Park tourism

Yosemite National Park is best known for its waterfalls and deep valleys. The diverse landscape supports more than 400 species. Whilst there, people may spot many amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. One noteworthy sighting is that of the Sierra Nevada red fox. The park is one of few places in the USA where people can see a rainbow at night.
